The largest sector in Yellowstone County, Montana is Health Care and Social Assistance, employing 15,216 workers. The next-largest sectors in the region are Retail Trade (11,192 workers) and Accommodation and Food Services (10,051). High location quotients (LQs) indicate sectors in which a region has high concentrations of employment compared to the national average. The sectors with the largest LQs in the region are Wholesale Trade (LQ = 1.57), Arts, Entertainment, and Recreation (1.34), and Construction (1.33).



- > Downtown Housing: According to housing development tracking by Big Sky Economic Development, there is over \$100M in long-term housing development coming to our downtown core. This equates to hundreds of units, in addition to mixed commercial opportunities for our business professionals and tourism visitors spending time downtown.
- For comparison, there were just 11 units built downtown in a decade in the early 2000s.
- Did you know? The Billings Heights has approximately **33,000** people, making it comparable to the size of our state's capital, Helena.

Tourism supports many important initiatives in our region and brings people to Billings to recreate, enjoy sporting events, and more all-year round. It also supports the growth of our top industries, including retail and hospitality.

- As of the 24-25 School Year, SD2 will be home to Montana's first "College Ready" charter school, giving students the opportunity to earn their high school diploma and associate degree on graduation day.
- Rocky Mountain College Montana's first college. Rocky has both undergraduate and master's programs.
 50% of graduates join the Billings workforce. Campus represents all 50 states, 17 tribal nations, and 26 countries.
- Montana State University Billings and City College Over 80% of graduates seek employment locally, and almost 50% are first-generation college graduates.
- Rocky Vista University opened Montana's first medical School, RVU School of Osteopathic Medicine in Billings. In 2024, they announced plans to open the first School of Veterinary Medicine in the state and region on their existing campus. These two investments bolster the strength of higher education in our community as our seventh largest industry and have ripple effects to our local economy.
